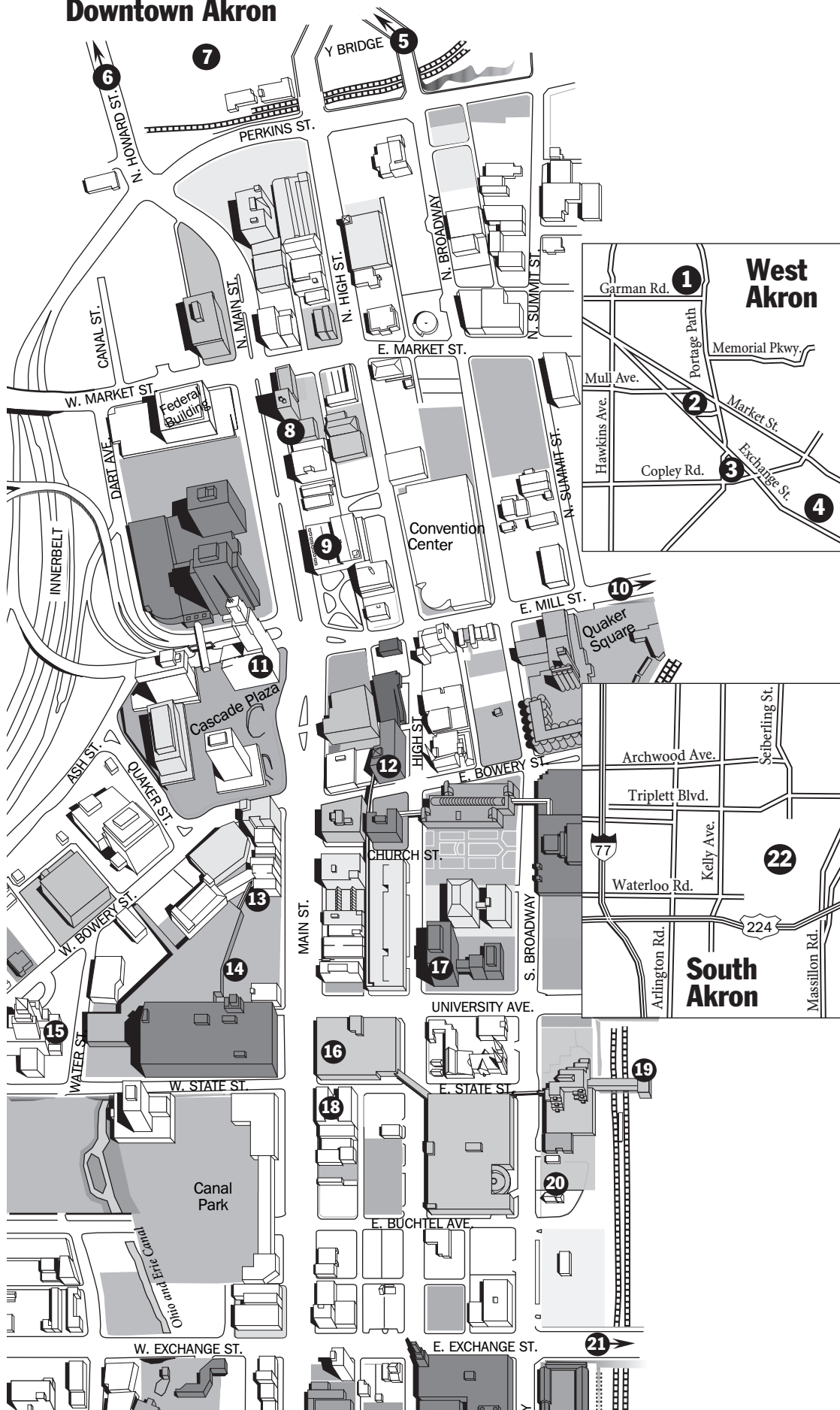


Akron History Trails

Downtown Akron



1 Stan Hywet Hall & Gardens

714 N. Portage Path
Former home of Goodyear co-founder F.A. Seiberling.

2 Dr. Bob's House

855 Ardmore Ave.
Home of Alcoholics Anonymous co-founder Dr. Robert Smith.

3 Perkins Stone Mansion and John Brown House

550 Copley Road
Neighboring homes of Akron's founding family and the famous abolitionist.

4 Glendale Cemetery

150 Glendale Ave.
Founded in 1839, it is the final resting place of many well-known local industrialists and civic leaders.

5 Akron A.A. Archives

775 N. Main St.
Exhibit traces the birth of Alcoholics Anonymous to present day.

6 Cascade Locks Park and the Mustill House & Store

248 Ferndale St.
Restored canal-era store featured at this Metro park.

7 Cuyahoga Valley Scenic Railroad, Northside Station

27 Ridge St.
Traces its roots to the Valley Railway of 1880, which transported coal and passengers.

8 TV Dinner Club Museum

13 S. Main St.
History, art and artifacts of mid-

20th-century American television.

9 Akron-Summit County Public Library

60 S. High St.
The special collections division boasts extensive genealogy collections, as well as special collections of area groups and individuals.

10 Hower House

60 Fir Hill
Victorian mansion built in 1871 by industrialist John Henry Hower.

11 FirstMerit Tower

106 S. Main St.
Akron's first skyscraper opened in 1931 as the Central Depositors Bank & Trust Co.

12 CitiCenter

146 S. High St.
Formerly the Young Women's Christian Association, opened in 1931.

13 Akron Civic Theatre

182 S. Main St.
This 1929 theater is one of four "atmospheric" theaters remaining in the country.

14 Akron History Exhibit Lock 3 Park, Downtown

Operated by various historical organizations, with an emphasis on Akron's canal days.

15 Young Men's Christian Association

80 W. Center St.
Opened in 1931, the building is still home to the YMCA, as well as upscale apartments.

16 University of Akron

Archives (Polsky Building)

225 S. Main St.
A collection relating to the university, Akron and a nine-county region of Northeast Ohio.

17 Akron Police Museum Stubbs Justice Center

217 S. High St., Room 402
Artifacts and memorabilia, from the macabre to the inspiring.

18 Mayflower Manor

263 S. Main St.
The Mayflower Hotel opened in 1931 as Akron's premier hotel; now an apartment building.

19 McClain Gallery of Akron's Black History

University of Akron, 220 Wolf Ledges Parkway
Buckingham Center
Exhibit on local African-American people, events and culture.

20 Old Stone School

301 S. Broadway
A one-room schoolhouse built in 1840.

21 Akron Fire History Exhibit, Fire Station No. 2

952 E. Exchange St.
This working fire station includes artifacts of yesteryear.

22 Akron Fulton Airport Terminal Building, Airdock, Derby Downs, Rubber Bowl, Guggenheim Airship Institute

These historic buildings are all within sight of each other off Triplett Boulevard.
